Donations and Helping Hand Update!

Since November 1st, \$54,800 in individual donations and \$14,400 in local unit and district donations (a total of nearly \$70,000!) have been made to the Foundation. Because of the support you have shown, both monetarily and by promoting "A Helping Hand" in your area, TRTF is doing what we have set out to do: help others!

TRTA members always go out of their way to ensure that the Texas Retired Teachers Foundation is successful by supporting its three charitable programs: the newly launched "A Helping Hand," Classroom Assistance Grants, and Student Scholarships. Our student scholarships and grants for classroom teachers will be awarded in April (learn more about who is eligible to apply and how on page 3).

"A Helping Hand" continues to provide assistance to retirees in need. **Since January 1st, TRTF has awarded**

grants totaling \$2,260 to retirees, paying for medical bills, roof repairs, and eyeglasses. TRTF has awarded a total of \$5,800 in grants since "A Helping Hand" launched statewide in October 2010. Thank you for continuing to make donations to this valuable program. Your gifts ensure the program's continuance and the Foundation's ability to assist more retirees experiencing critical emergencies.

Student Scholarships & Classroom Assistance Grants!

The 2011-2012 TRTF Student Scholarship and Classroom Assistance Grant applications are ready! **Please note** that applications for both programs have undergone significant changes since the 2010-2011 award year, and it is advised that all applicants download the newest applications.

For the 2011-2012 school year, TRTF will award 10 \$500 student scholarships and 10 \$500 classroom assistance grants!

All completed applications are due to TRTF by Thursday, March 17, 2010 at 5:00 pm. The names of the 2011-2012 scholarship and grant recipients will be announced at the 2011 Convention of the Texas Retired Teachers Association during the Foundation luncheon. The convention will be held in San Antonio on April 12, 13, and 14. Winners do not need to be present and will be notified by telephone and/ or by e-mail after the convention.

Student STUDENT SCHOLARHIPS



Students who are relatives of a member of the Texas Retired Teachers Association (TRTA), and who are pursuing an

undergraduate or masters degree in education at a Texas university or college are eligible to apply for the TRTF Student Scholarship. Transcripts must be included with each application. Recipients must provide proof of enrollment before funds will be awarded.


